## **Donning Instructions**

1. Put vest on as shown in donning procedure pictogram.

**Caution: Do Not Wear Life Jacket Under Clothing** 

- 2. Zip up heavy duty zipper
- 3. Adjust 'X' straps for proper fit, as shown at right.
- 4. Fold excess back straps. as necessary, and secure in strap stowage pockets.

### Inflation & Use Instructions

- 1. Do not inflate life vest while inside aircraft.
- 2. After exiting the aircraft, pull sharply down on the beaded handle, item 5, for inflation.
- 3. To access oral inflation tube, open the cover where indicated by the pictograph on front cover.
- 4. Survivor locator light will come on when battery makes contact with water.

#### **Maintenance and Care**

FAA-approved life vests must be serviced periodically by an approved service facility.

Always inspect your life vest prior to donning:

- Check for damage to the outer covering, supporting jacket material and straps. If any damage is evident, the jacket should be inspected by an authorized service center prior to use.
- Check to ensure that the zipper on the outer covering is secure all along the side and that the ends are secure with hook & pile fastener.
- Check to ensure that the beaded handle is in place at the bottom of the jacket, secured with hook & pile fastener, in its proper location.
